



## **ABOUT THE BLUE INK PLAYWRITING AWARD**

The nationally-renown Blue Ink Playwriting Award was created in 2010 to support new work. Since inception, we've named 11 Award winners, 95 finalists, and 139 semi-finalists. Over \$9,000 in cash and prizes were distributed to playwrights in 2021.

Previous winners include Yussef El Guindi's *Refugee Rhapsody* (2021), Andrea Stolowitz' *Recent Unsettling Events* (2020), Benjamin Benne's *ALMA* (2019), Inda Craig-Galván's *Welcome to Matteson!* (2018), Idris Goodwin's *Hype Man* (2017), Nathan Alan Davis's *The Wind and the Breeze* (2016), and Jamie Pachino's *Other Than Honorable* (2015).

Each year, American Blues Theater accepts worldwide submissions of original, unpublished full-length plays. The winning play will be selected by Artistic Director Gwendolyn Whiteside and the theater's award-winning Ensemble.

The playwright receives a monetary prize of \$2,000. Cash prizes are awarded to finalists and semi-finalists too. All proceeds of the administrative fee are distributed for playwrights' cash prizes.

Submissions will be accepted by American Blues Theater from July 1, 2021 to August 31, 2021 at 11:59pm CT. Playwrights may only submit one (1) manuscript each year for consideration, and plays must be submitted digitally as a PDF or Word Document via the submission form at [AmericanBluesTheater.com](http://AmericanBluesTheater.com).

# BLUE INK PLAYWRITING AWARD SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

---

Please follow these guidelines in preparing your manuscript:

1. There is a \$5 administration fee.
2. This contest is restricted to plays written in the English language. Worldwide submissions are accepted.
3. Submissions must be original, unpublished full-length plays written in English. Adaptations are accepted with proof of rights held unless source text is in public domain. Translations, musicals, and children's plays are not accepted.
4. Playwrights may submit only one (1) manuscript per year.
5. Plays that have been professionally produced or published are not eligible. Plays that have had a workshop, reading, or non-professional production will be considered.
6. Plays may not be under option or scheduled for professional production or publication at the time of submission.
7. American Blues Theater reserves the Right-of-First-Refusal to produce the world premiere of the winning manuscript for one (1) year beginning on date of the public announcement of the winner.
8. Plays must be submitted digitally as a PDF or Word Document via the submission form at [AmericanBluesTheater.com](http://AmericanBluesTheater.com). Fees may also be submitted digitally.

**Submissions for the 2022 competition must be submitted no earlier than July 1, 2021 and no later than August 31, 2021 at 11:59pm CT.**
